Implementation Update

- Per federal regulations, all HIPAA-covered entities that use ICD-9 today will be required to use ICD-10 starting 10/1/15
- Ohio Medicaid completed ICD-10 implementation in MITS on 9/9/14 and is prepared for the 10/1/15 federal compliance date
- Ohio Administrative Code rules and policies have been updated to use the appropriate ICD-10 terminology and codes and most will be effective on 10/1/15
- EDI testing in CERT for ICD-10 started in mid-2014 and will continue to be available through go-live
- For Medicaid managed care plans, please reach out to the specific plan that you work with for implementation and testing information



Billing Guidance

- All claims with dates of service or a through date of service on or after Thursday, October 1, 2015 for healthcare services must use ICD-10
 - The compliance date is based on:
 - Date of service for outpatient and professional services
 - Through date of service for inpatient/ institutional services
- There is no transition period; 10/1/15 is a hard date for compliance



Billing Guidance

- If your organization does not use ICD-10 for services provided on and after 10/1/15, your claims will deny
- ICD-9 codes will continue to be used on claims with dates of service or through date of service prior to 10/1/15
- ICD-9 and ICD-10 CAN be in the same file but NOT on the same claim



Survey – Overall Results & Answers

- 2nd ICD-10 Trading Partner Survey as conducted in December 2014
- Purpose was to obtain some insight on readiness, conduct outreach, and share testing information
- 75 responses received
 - 14 represented more than 100 providers (one even said 28,000)
 - 23 represented 10-99 providers
 - 13 represented 2-10 providers
 - 25 said they were a provider with a TP number



Survey – Individual Question Results

- TPs share information with providers in multiple ways
 - E-mail, face-to-face meetings, newsletters, web portal messages, US mail, teleconferences, network notifications, forums, in-house training
 - A few TPs are the provider so information was not forwarded
- TPs responding submit a variety of claim types
- All except 3 said they would be ready to submit ICD-10 on 10/1/2015
- All except 4 said they planned to test with Ohio Medicaid
- 59 said they would like Ohio Medicaid to contact them regarding testing
 - if contact information was provided, they were contacted



Survey – Questions Received

Q: Can you provide more information on ICD-10 testing?

A: Testing information is being provided in this webinar and is also available on Ohio Medicaid's ICD-10 webpage

Q: Can you provide a list of ICD-10 codes and descriptions?

A: Ohio Medicaid cannot provide a list of codes, but the codes are available on CMS's ICD-10 website

Q: Can you tell us how ICD-10 relates to the DSM?

- Neither DSM-IV nor DSM-5 is a HIPAA-mandated code set, and therefore may not be used in HIPAA-standard transactions. Clinicians may continue to base their diagnostic decisions using the DSM criteria, but those codes must be translated to appropriate ICD-10-CM codes when billing Ohio Medicaid.

Testing - General

- The CERT region is currently available for end-to-end testing with trading partners
- Trading partners may verify that inbound and outbound transactions are being processed correctly
- As of Monday June 1, 2015 the ICD-10 start date in the CERT region will be April 1, 2015
- For all testing purposes April 1, 2015 = Oct. 1, 2015
- If you are testing scenarios other than ICD-10, use DOS prior to 4/1/15 to successfully process using ICD-9



Testing - Scenarios

APRIL 1, 2015 = OCTOBER 1, 2015

Claim Type	Processing Requirement	Effective October 1, 2015
Inpatient and Inpatient Crossover	Providers are not allowed to mix ICD-9 and ICD-10 codes on the same claim.	Use THROUGH date
Outpatient and Outpatient crossover	For dates of service that span October 1, 2015, providers must separate claims submissions so that ICD-9 codes remain on one claim (dates of service before October 1, 2015) and all ICD-10 codes remain on the other claim (dates of service on or after October 1, 2015).	Use FROM date
Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC)	FQHC crossover claims from Medicare are processed as outpatient crossover claims.	Use FROM date
Long-term care and Inpatient crossover	If the long-term care (LTC) claim has a THROUGH date on or after October 1, 2015, the entire claim is billed using ICD-10.	Use THROUGH date
Medical, Medical Crossover, and Dental	Use the FROM date on the detail.	Use FROM date on the



Testing – File Transfers

- For trading partners who are set up using WFTS use:

- Your organization may need to use the ‘forgot password’ link the first time you log in
 - This password is NOT the same as your production password

Testing – Important Information

- An 835 remittance advice will be generated in the CERT region for any provider your trading partner currently represents
- Test all business scenarios
 - Dates of service prior to 10/1/15 (4/1/15) and after 10/1/15 (4/1/15)
 - Previously paid claims recoded in ICD-10 are recommended
 - CMS’s Critical Success Factors
 - Please contact our ICD-10 e-mail box for a list of CMS’s recommended testing scenarios or what they call Critical Success Factors
- When testing:
 - Set the ISA15 segment to “T” for testing
 - If a rejected 999 is received, review the TRC file, make corrections and then send a new file
 - Once your files are processed, review the U277, 824, and 835 files.

Testing – Timeline

- ODM is asking trading partners to test by July 31,2015
- It is highly recommended that trading partners test sooner rather than later
 - Ensures any issues encountered can be resolved



Testing – Other Opportunities

- Other payers, including CMS and Medicaid managed care plans
- CollabT – Free coding practice tool
 - CMS’s contractor, Noblis, subcontracted with Edifecs to develop a testing tool for State Medicaid Agencies and their providers
 - The web-based tool provides the opportunity to practice ICD-10 coding with real medical records and provides instantaneous feedback so coders can learn from their mistakes and gain confidence in their ICD-10 coding abilities
